MentalHealth⁺ ResearchUK

Mental Health Research UK—PhD Scholarships 2022

Deadline: 31 March 2021 (internal)

Funding for a four year PhD studentship, which includes home student tuition fees and stipend for the first three years, and then stipend and thesis fee for the fourth year as a writing-up year. Two types of fellowships are available:

- John Grace QC Scholarship 2022 – New approaches to treating schizophrenia
- Impact of COVID-19 on understanding mental health, race and intersectionality

Applicants must be eligible PIs, students do not apply directly. UCL may only submit one application for each Scholarship, and therefore are running an [internal selection process](#).



BMA foundation grants 2021

Deadline: 7 May 2021

Applications are invited from medical practitioners and/or research scientists for research in progress or prospective research. Each grant provides £65,000 for a research area. The following topics invite applications from UK-registered medical practitioners or research scientists:

- Gastroenterology
- Viral diseases of respiratory system
- Mental health through clinical trials
- Antimicrobials
- Schizophrenia
- Mental health of medical students
- Stroke

Cystic Fibrosis Trust

Cystic Fibrosis Trust Strategic Research Centre

Deadline: 26 April 2021

Funding to establish virtual centres of excellence in cystic fibrosis research to tackle multidisciplinary research issues of strategic relevance.

The centres should typically comprise a lead PI (based at an eligible research active academic institution), together with 4-5 Co-Is working with young scientists or researchers (eg PhD students, research assistants, early stage career professionals or early postdoctoral scientists). The programme will provide funding of up to £750,000 to support the stipends/salaries of the early-career/young researchers in training for the duration of the centre, which should be three to four years. Funding may include four-year PhD studentships based at UK institutions, to cover stipend for the student, fees and research costs.

Deadline: 24 March 2021

Applications to become either a research cluster leader or an associate member. The MRC is investing more than £20 million over five years in a major new National Mouse Genetics Network for disease modelling, to accelerate our understanding of human disease.

Experimental medicine grants

Deadline: 28 April 2021

Funding to investigate the causes, progression and treatment of human disease.



LifeArc

GOSHCC/LifeArc Translational Research Accelerator Grants

Deadline: 16 April 2021

A total of £1M available to fund a small number of translational projects for up to 3 years in duration. The scheme is designed to support applications on the translational pathway with the expectation that researchers will continue to develop their therapy/ diagnostic after GOSH charity/LifeArc funding, either by securing further funding from external translational schemes (from funders such as the Medical Research Council, National Institute for Health Research, Innovate UK and others), or partnering with/ licensing to industry.



Transforming UK food systems for health and environment

Deadline: 22 April 2021 (EOI)

Funding for 2-3 years to support interdisciplinary research into interventions that will transform the UK food system. Your project should bring together elements from both of these areas:

- production, processing, manufacturing, food environments
- healthier diets and consumption.



Investigating the mechanisms to prevent hypersensitivities to food

Deadline: 8 April 2021

Funding for up to 3 years to reduce and prevent food hypersensitivities. UK-based researchers must apply as part of a transnational consortium of three to six partners.

Projects should focus on one of the following:

- understanding the mechanisms that induce or prevent food intolerances and allergies
- improving methods to determine or detect adverse reactions
- the impact of food ingredients and food processing.

The UK part of the project must be within BBSRC, MRC or FSA's remit. 4-5 projects are expected to be funded.
