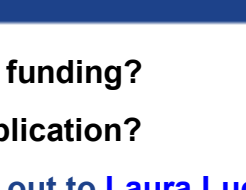

Funding Opportunities



All research funding applications **MUST** be [registered with R&D](#) at least **15 days before the funder deadline** to get costings and approvals in time for the funders deadline.

[GOSH BRC Education Programmes Internship](#)

Funder deadline: 20/06/22

Funding available: £15,000 to support salary costs



Eligibility: call for applications for an internship within GOSH Biomedical Research Centre's Experimental Medicine Academy (EMA) cross-cutting theme to support an exciting programme of career development activities for early career researchers. Funder deadline: 21/06/22

Funding available: a total fund of £1M per round



Eligibility: LifeArc and Action Medical Research (AMR) have recently launched the fourth funding round designed to support translational research into children's rare disease. They are particularly encourage applications for early-career, independent investigators (e.g., university lecturer within five years of first appointment). [GOSH BRC Advanced Treatments for Structural Malformations & Tissue Damage \(ATSMTD\) 2022 Knowledge Transfer Scheme](#)

Funder deadline: 27/06/22 2pm

Funding available: maximum funding allowance of £5,000 per placement available



Duration of funding: placements should last from two to four weeks

Eligibility: The GOSH BRC Advanced Treatments for Structural Malformations & Tissue Damage (ATSMTD) theme 2022 Knowledge Transfer Scheme, is designed support clinical and non-clinical early career scientists with a PhD (or equivalent) to undertake a placement at an external laboratory, national and international. We anticipate funding 4-5 placements.

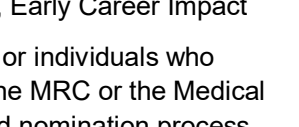
Eligible applicants are GOSH and/or ICH employees, and researchers who receive a salary support from GOSH BRC. However, applicants cannot have held the award more than twice over the current BRC funding period (2017-2022) or have been awarded last years (2021) award.

Funding available: funded time (1 day/week 1st Oct 22 - 31st Mar 23)

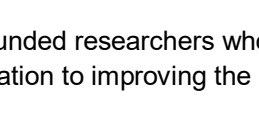

[MRC Impact Prize 2022](#)

Funder deadline: 05/07/22 12 noon

Funding available: up to £20,000



Eligibility: The MRC Impact Prize 2022 has been launched in 2022 to recognise individuals and teams who have made outstanding impacts in the following three areas: Open Science Impact, Outstanding Team Impact, Early Career Impact

[MRC Millennium Medal 2022](#)

Funder deadline: 05/07/22 12 noon

Eligibility: The MRC Millennium Medal 2022 is the MRC's most prestigious award and recognises an exceptional researcher who has made a major contribution towards MRC's mission to improve human health through world-class medical research.



We will be accepting organisation nominations for MRC-funded researchers who demonstrate scientific excellence and impact, and a dedication to improving the wider research environment and culture.

The winner will be listed amongst the most highly influential and impactful researchers in the UK and will present a lecture and receive a Medal that is specially created by The Royal Mint at a dedicated MRC Awards Ceremony in spring 2023. [GOSH Charity and Sparks National Funding Call 2022/2023](#)

Funder deadline: 07/07/22 5pm

Funding available: £2 million available - above £50,000 and up to £250,000 per application



Eligibility: Project grant applications for paediatric health research studies focusing on complex or rare diseases. The call will support research across the spectrum of medical conditions affecting the foetus, neonates and children directly, as well as pregnancy disorders that affect the child.

[Clinical Informatics Research Programme Application for Funding](#)

Funder deadline: 08/07/22

Funding available: up to £5,000



Duration of funding: Applications can be made for costs already incurred will be accepted for consideration, the spending must have taken place after 31.3.22

Eligibility: Thanks to the generous support of GOSH Children's Charity, GOSH DRIVE has established a clinical informatics research programme (CIRP) to support clinical informatics research at GOSH and UCL. Our aim is to support research that seeks to use data and technology to transform the way we deliver care, for the benefit of patients at GOSH and the wider NHS. Consequently, projects seeking funding from this opportunity must be focussed on informatics research, funding will not be provided for clinical or laboratory projects where data analytics is not the main focus. Unfortunately, we cannot support the costs of salary, PhD stipend, or PhD fees through this call. [EME Application Acceleration Award – International platform studies in precision medicine](#)

Funder deadline: 18/07/22 1pm

Funding available: no upper limit but all funding requested should be clearly justified



Duration of funding: no fixed limits on the duration of projects

Eligibility: The Efficacy and Mechanism Evaluation (EME) Programme is accepting straight to Stage 2 applications to their commissioned workstream. All proposals submitted must fall within the remit/scope of the EME Programme and further information can be found on the [EME Programme webpage](#).

All primary research projects are expected to establish a programme appointed Study Steering Committee and it is important that you read the TSC/SSC Guidance before completing your application. Costs incurred by this committee should be included in the budget as appropriate.

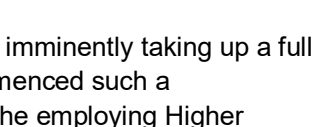


[Academy of Medical Science – Springboard grant](#)

Funding available: maximum of £500K

Duration: 5 years



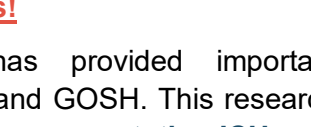

Duration: up to 3 years

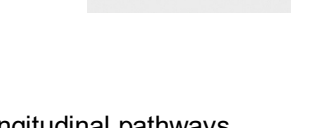

Eligibility: Designed to attract qualified, promising scientists entering their professional career in the T1D research field; intended for those in a relatively early state in their career. MD, DMD, DVM, PhD, or equivalent required. Must not be simultaneously serving an internship or residency
